SHARING THE JOURNEY A BLAST FROM THE PAST

July/August 2022

Last Wednesday night as I watched the Bela family from Kosovo walk onto the tarmac at the airport in Roanoke a flood of emotions raced through me. On the one hand I was embarrassed that I had so much while they had so little. They brought their sole possessions to the United States in a little bag smaller than the ones in which we use to carry Jared's diapers.

I was embarrassed that I had not listened to the news reports of the war in their country with more interest. I was embarrassed that I had been exposed daily to news of the war there and our political debate here over the appropriateness of U.S. involvement. These were human beings. They were hungry. Their children wore clothing that no longer fit. Their faces were emaciated. Their feet were covered with worn out shoes still covered with Macedonian dust. Their tear-stained faces and their frightened eyes embarrassed me that I was so well fed and my closet

It was sin that put these children at risk. It was the sins of hatred and indifference that caused so much hurt in their country. As I have listened to them, through their interpreters, tell of the horrors that they have endured I am reminded all to clearly of the stirring testimony of Nesse Godin, the Holocaust survivor who spoke in Martinsville earlier this year, of how deadly the sin of hatred can be.

We live in the greatest country in the world! Americans are free from the tyranny of an oppressive government. We are free from a police state where soldiers roam the street and suspects are shot without a trial. We are free to worship as we please. We are free to be Baptist, Catholic, Methodist, or Muslim without the fear of bloodshed. We are free to be German, or Irish, English, African, or Albanian decent without the fear of ethnic cleansing. Our freedom is a precious commodity. Freedom provides us both security and opportunity.

As Christians we enjoy an even greater freedom. Through the work of Jesus Christ and our faith in Him as God's one and only Son we are free from the condemnation of sin. Being free from the sentence of sin provides us security. But we are also free to go and do in Christ's name because sin cannot harm us; this is opportunity. Therefore, both as Christians and as citizens of these great United States, we possess wonderful freedoms that provide tremendous security and opportunity. These dual freedoms demand that we act responsibly.

When we are exposed to the plight of others each of us are moved to appreciate our security both in Christ and in our nation. But how many of us consider the great opportunity our freedom provides? If we do not take advantage of the opportunity God has given us, we run the risk of falling victim to the sin of indifference; and that can be as devastating and hurtful a sin as the sin of hatred to which the ethnic Albanians have endured.

On this 4th of July, as we appreciate our country's heritage, let us also give thanks for our heritage as the chosen children of God. Let us use the gift of freedom wisely. Our freedom American has purchased with the blood of patriots; it will last but a lifetime. Our freedom from sin was purchased with the blood of Jesus; and it will last an eternity. Let us go in Jesus' name making disciples of all the nations.
