SHARING THE JOURNEY

March/April 2024

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! I hope and pray that everyone had a good end of 2023 and are anticipating what wonderful blessings God has in store for us in the year 2024. As you know we didn't have a newsletter for January/February because there wasn't a whole lot to report, and we were just coming down from the Advent and Christmas seasons. Now that we're in the March/April newsletter we're ready to go and ready to enjoy what God has for us! So many wonderful things on the horizon; not least of which, of course, is Easter. Easter is on March 31st this year so it's coming fast.

Here recently since the beginning of the year we have had messages to remind us that God will provide for us if we will but put our faith in Him and trust everything that we have to Him vs. trusting everything with ourselves. We've had (I think) some very poignant messages to remind us that God's in control and that He will provide. I was reading in my devotions recently of yet another instance of God's provision and promise from Judges 6 when God calls Gideon to do this task: tear down the altar to Baal and replace it with an altar to God. Gideon does the task in the dead of night to avoid being seen. However, the men of the town know Gideon is the one who tore down the altar to their false god and erected and altar to the true God. The ensuing anger turns into the Midianite army along with their allies amassing across the Jordan ready to go to war with Gideon and the people of Israel. The devotional account states that Gideon is the "fearless leader" of the Israelites but in truth Gideon isn't so fearless after all. Gideon asks God for a sign: he tells God he will lay a fleece on the threshing floor, and if there is dew on the wool the next morning Gideon says that this will prove to him that God has chosen him to be the leader of the Israelites. Sure enough, the next morning the fleece was damp with dew. But Gideon asks for another sign: this one that the fleece will be dry the next morning with dew everywhere else. The next morning the fleece was dry. The rest of the story: Gideon leads the Israelite army to victory.

Here's the takeaway: do we require multiple signs from God to "prove" His intentions for us? God may very well give us signs if we ask for them but consider this: can't we trust Him when He speaks to us knowing that He will provide simply by looking to His word and accounts like this story from Judges 6 in addition to many other examples from Scripture where God has taken care of His people? Or do we take God at His word and do whatever task He has called us to? May I challenge all of us to first of all, be diligently seeking God's will for us, and number two, trust Him when He leads us into whatever His will is for us instead of wanting sign after sign after sign before we believe that God will lead us and provide for us.

Whatever God's call is, trust that He will provide. He's proven it in multiple accounts in His word, and I bet we all could fill pages of testimony of accounts in our own lives where He's provided, protected, and granted.
