Greetings in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ!

As I sit here and write this, I look out the window at the beauty of the spring morning. We have come through the bleak winter into the beauty of the springtime. It reminds me of the seasons of the crucifixion and Easter that we have recently celebrated. Now, our hearts focus on the coming celebrations of Mother's Day, Father's Day, and any other celebrations that we are engaged in during the late spring and early summer.

Considering the beauty of the springtime, isn't it beautiful that we as Christians have the victory, and that is as beautiful as the springtime (more beautiful even)? Because we have victory, we need not fear what may go on around us. I'm reminded of the stories we find in Mark 5. First, we see Jesus heal a man who is demon possessed; when no other means could cure him (Mark 5:1-20). Then we see Jesus as he is asked to leave that place, goes to another place where He is immediately met by Jairus: a ruler of the synagogue whose daughter is lying at the point of death. As Jesus is trying to make His way through the crowds a woman who has spent all trying to find a cure for her disease exercises just a scant bit of faith and touches the hem of Jesus' garment and is immediately healed (Mark 5:25-34). Lastly, we see Jesus finally arriving at the home of Jairus, where He heals Jairus' daughter. I love the words that Jesus says when He arrives at the home of Jairus and the family members there say that his daughter has already died. Jesus says, "Be not afraid, only believe" (Mark 5:36).

Through all three of these accounts, we see in Mark 5, one theme is prevalent: the use of faith. Yes, there are some fears, yes there is some uncertainty, but the overriding theme is faith over fear. The demoniac of Gadara in verses 1-20 runs to Jesus; I believe even in the midst of demon possession; the man knew to trust Jesus. The woman with the issue of blood had the attitude: "If I could touch just the hem of His garment I will be healed." Finally, Jairus

knew that Jesus would be able to heal his daughter. The common denominator in these accounts is faith.

Folks, we may have some difficult times: we have people that we love going through illness, grief, maybe even some hopelessness. We don't have to fear these things. What does Jesus say? "Be not afraid, only believe."
