We have been experiencing some rich blessings over this year and I know we will experience even more in the coming year! As we come to the November/December newsletter we are in anticipation of the holiday season coming up and all the things that come with that. We are so thankful that we get to see the end of another year; we know not what the new year will bring but we trust God the whole way.

That being said, I want to encourage everyone to make prayer a priority. Being as how Veteran's Day is in November I want to quote the story of Patton's prayer. If you've ever seen the movie "Patton" you've seen the fictionalization of this prayer, but I feel it's necessary that we know the whole story and how it can help our prayer life.

In the latter days of World War II, December 1944, a rainy and foggy weather situation was hampering the Third Army's efforts to break through and relieve the city of Bastogne. General Patton called on his chaplain, Chaplain (Colonel) James O'Neill, to come up with a prayer for the weather. If there was to be a victory, the weather would have to cooperate. Chaplain O'Neill searched a number of prayer books and couldn't come up with a suitable prayer, so he wrote the following prayer: Almighty and most merciful Father, we humbly beseech Thee, of Thy great goodness, to restrain these immoderate rains with which we've had to contend. Grant us fair weather for battle. Graciously hearken to us as soldiers who call upon Thee that, armed with Thy power, we may advance from victory to victory, and crush the oppression and wickedness of our enemies and establish Thy justice among men and nations. Amen.

In a talk with the chaplain, General Patton emphasized the importance of prayer, no matter where or under what circumstances. The "end of the story" as Paul Harvey used to say, is that the weather broke, and the Third Army was able to relieve the city of Bastogne.

Prayer is not a substitute for effort and work, but it is an indispensable ingredient in our life. If we are to achieve victory, deliverance, and blessing, we must be a people of prayer. May we end this year in prayer thanking God for His blessings and invoking His presence in every aspect of our lives.
